

## **Student Engagement**


- Transitioned to all virtual student appointments without losing ground. Overall volume stayed about the same as the previous year (up 2%).
- Opened up our office and gave up our desks to become a very popular study space for students.
- Launched an Instagram account (attracting 200 followers in the first six weeks) and updated <u>our website</u>.
- Attracted 244% more students to workshops and events such as Career Camp and the 30 Day Challenge (2,014 registrations vs. 826 last year).

#### **Employer Engagement**


- Held two virtual recruiting fairs, attracting more out-of-state employers than in previous years.
- Launched our new Employer Advisory Council with representatives from 10 key organizations representing multiple industries.
- Connected with Pfizer to refer new grads (science majors) to work in their vaccine production facility in Kalamazoo.





### **Alumni Engagement**

- Held virtual workshops and information sessions almost every week featuring Hope alumni from multiple disciplines.
- Conducted an increased level of virtual appointments with alumni - up 27% over last year.



## Academic Program Involvement

- Partnered with faculty to lead presentations in 87 class sessions, impacting about 1,800 students.
- Administered grant funding to enhance two required major courses with vocational exploration and career transitions content: PSY 295 Human Strengths and Struggles, and EDUC 275 Secondary Teacher Education.

## **Integrated Advising**

- Conducted 564 pre-health advising appointments (up 6% over last year).
- Provided guidance and coaching to 26 students applying to medical school, resulting in 22 acceptances (85%) in an extremely selective year.

## **Highlights from the Year**

### **CFL Integration**

In January of this year, the Center for Leadership (CFL) became a part of the Boerigter Center. Established in 2006, the CFL has a strong track record of preparing students for the future through the leadership minor, student consulting operations, and leadership development for students. We recognized a number of ways these efforts are synergistic with the emerging work of the Boerigter Center, and we are eager to position the topic of leadership as one that spans across all academic divisions of the college.



### **Focus on Diversity**

This year, we increased our efforts on topics related to diversity, equity, and inclusion, partnering with the Center for Diversity & Inclusion and others on campus.

- We held multiple workshops for students and alumni focused on diversity in the workplace.
- We updated our website to include resources for historically underrepresented students.
- As a team, our staff engaged in multiple professional development opportunities.
- In October, we led a career discernment workshop with 39 local high school students who were part of Hope's TRIO/Upward Bound program.
- We saw a meaningful impact in our outreach to first-year students. 32% of our 1:1
  appointments were with students of color (compared to 18% of students of color on
  campus), and 21% of our 1:1 appointments were with first-generation students (compared to
  14% of first-generation students on campus).

### **Experiential Learning Student Grants**

As a part of a program sponsored by NetVUE we were able to award experiential learning grants to 11 students totaling \$15,750. The student recipients included freshmen, sophomores, juniors, and seniors and were students of color and/or high-financial need students. The students also represent a diverse set of majors including Nursing, Biology, Global Studies, Dance, and Psychology. Students have been able to apply their learning through on-site and remote experiences working in settings such as Mary Free Bed Rehabilitation Center, The New York Dance Project Summer Intensive Program, and a variety of other internship sites.



## **Expanding Skills Training**

We are in our second year of offering targeted skills training to all Hope students. By adding an externally recognized, in-demand credential to their résumés, students will be able to stand out when applying for their first job. We continued to offer Tableau (to 94 additional students) and expanded to offer a certificate in Salesforce, a leading customer relationship management system (61 student registrations). We were excited to see a 72% completion rate for students who participated in last year's cohort, and we were thrilled to see some of them land data analytics jobs at places such as NielsenIQ and NPD Group in Chicago.

### **Group Innovation Award**

Our work on targeted skills training received national attention through an award from the American College Personnel Association (ACPA). They recognized our work and our innovative partnership with the Van Wylen Library by awarding us the Commission for Career Services Group Innovation Award. We are proud of our work and thankful for the recognition, which was also highlighted by a <u>Hope College news article</u>.



#### **Interactive Monitor**

During the fall and spring semesters, we worked with a group of Computer Science majors to develop a special app called "Where Will You Go?" The app is displayed on a large touch-screen monitor in the lobby of the Boerigter Center, and it shows locations of alumni and career opportunities around the world, along with highlighted alumni stories. This monitor has become a major focal point for guests over the past few months. Stop by and check it out!



## **We're Being Watched**

Throughout the year we were benchmarked by 14 colleges and universities from Massachusetts to Maryland to Michigan to Missouri and beyond. They are interested in how we develop programs, use software, and structure our staff. While we all can learn from each other, this is a good sign that we are well on our way to achieving our vision of being nationally recognized as a leader amongst Christian liberal arts institutions.

## **What's Coming**

#### **New Director - Leadership Minor**

Starting in July 2021, Dr. Marcus Fila will be serving as the next faculty director for Hope's Leadership minor. Marcus is currently an Associate Professor of Management and has worked at Hope since 2013. He holds a Ph.D. in Leadership and Organizational Analysis from Western Michigan University. Prior to joining Hope, Marcus gained hands-on leadership experience working 10 years in international business development and recruitment. ## Dr. Malcolm H. McKay - Health Sciences Scholarship

In conjunction with our health professions advising program, we are looking forward to launching this new scholarship program in the coming academic year. Named in honor of Dr. Malcolm H. McKay, this scholarship was established to encourage students to pursue doctoral-level graduate studies in the medical, optometry, dental, physical therapy, or occupational therapy field upon graduation by making it a viable option versus other STEM graduate programs that offer tuition waivers and stipends. Initial funding for this scholarship has been provided through a generous gift, and we are looking forward to growing the impact as we get started!

#### The Future of Work Renovation Project

We are preparing to engage in a major renovation project to create a space focused on the "Future of Work." Located in a popular building in the middle of campus (the DeWitt Center), this space will be a new, collaborative home for the Center for Leadership, the Boerigter Center for Calling and Career, and the Office of Alumni and Family Engagement. This space has the opportunity to create important connections, begin and sustain lifelong relationships and strengthen the Hope College brand.

Specifically, this project will:

- Provide a collaborative environment for student and staff projects that tackle real-world challenges with alumni and employers.
- Create a welcoming home for alumni, adjacent to the Bookstore, to return for lifelong learning opportunities.
- Support students and staff with space to make professional presentations to companies seeking innovative ideas.
- Host on-campus interviews with recruiters from top organizations as well as networking events, career panels and presentations showcasing alumni career paths.
- Differentiate the value of Hope College for current and prospective students.
- Demonstrate best-in-class work and learning spaces that are adaptable to changing needs, integrate technology and help prepare students for leadership and the Future of Work.





We are currently in the fundraising phase and are eager to engage others who would like to be a part of this vision coming to life.
