

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE ENDORSEMENT FOR ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY TEACHING

English as a Second Language (State code: **NS**) is a K-12 endorsement that is offered to Elementary and Secondary track students to enhance their marketability by certifying them to teach in an ESL classroom setting. This 24 credit hour endorsement is in addition to a student's major and minor and thus cannot be declared as a stand-alone minor.

Teacher candidates seeking this endorsement must pass the Michigan Test for Teacher Certification (MTTC) English as a Second Language exam (Test #086). MTTC content exams should not be taken until 90% of course work in the subject area has been completed. The courses below meet State standards and have been selected so that teacher candidates will be well prepared for the test. Knowledge must be demonstrated in the following categories in order to successfully pass the MTTC subject area exam:
