# SPECIAL EDUCATION MAJOR WITH COMPREHENSIVE MAJOR ENDORSEMENT FOR LEARNING DISABILITIES FOR ELEMENTARY CERTIFICATION

Created July 2019 to be used for incoming freshman 2019 and later

The **Special Education endorsement major in Learning Disabilities** (State code: SM) for an Elementary teaching certificate consists of a minimum of 43 credits. Teacher candidates pursuing this major must also complete requirements for the Comprehensive Major (50 credits).

Teacher candidates for certification must pass the Michigan Test for Teacher Certification (MTTC) in Learning Disabilities (Test #063). MTTC content exams should not be taken until 90% of course work in the subject area has been completed. The courses below meet State standards and have been selected so that teacher candidates will be well prepared for the test. Knowledge must be demonstrated in the following categories in order to successfully pass the MTTC subject area exam:
