Michigan Future Educator Fellowship.

The fellowship provides Education students with up to \$10,000 towards their tuition each year for a maximum of three years.

In order to qualify for these funds, you must also meet the additional requirements:

- File the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)</u>. While this is not a need-based program, the FAFSA must be submitted as part of the application process.
- Have begun your first semester in the education program in the Fall 2022 semester or after.
- Be a high school graduate.
- Be enrolled at least full-time (at least 12 credit hours)
- Be working on your first teacher certification.
- Must have earned at least 56 semester credits
- Have a cumulative college GPA of at least 3.0.
- You and your parent(s) must be Michigan residents since July 1 of the previous calendar year.

If you believe that you have met all of those requirements, you may create an account and apply for the MI Future Educator Fellowship here. If your eligibility is confirmed, you will be issued a "Commitment to Teach Agreement," in which you are agreeing to teach in a MICHIGAN school (public, nonpublic, or public preschool) for a certain number of years.

The agreement is as follows:

Number of Academic Year(s) Fellowship Received	Recipient Agrees to Teach in a Michigan School
1 year	3 years
2 years	4 years
3 years	5 years

If you do not meet this service obligation requirement and/or don't finish the teacher certification program, the fellowship converts to a 0% interest rate loan with a repayment term of 10 years.
