### SOCIAL STUDIES GROUP MAJOR FOR ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOL TEACHING (K – 8)

The **Social Studies Group major** (State Code: RX) for Elementary Certification consists of 42 credits selected from four areas of emphasis: Economics, Geography, History, and Political Science.

Teacher candidates for certification must pass the Michigan Test for Teacher Certification (MTTC) Elementary Exam (Test #103). Teacher candidates are strongly recommended to also take the Elementary Social Studies exam (Test #105) for marketability purposes. MTTC content exams should not be taken until 90% of course work in the subject area has been completed.
