

SPANISH EDUCATION MAJOR FOR K-12 TEACHING with Comprehensive Major

Updated September 2015

CLARIFICATION OF OPTIONS:

Elementary certification track with K-12 endorsement is a major only. The **Spanish major** (State Code: FF) for a K-12 teaching endorsement consists of a minimum of 32 credits numbered 321 and above. Students pursuing this major must also complete requirements for the Comprehensive Major (50 credits).

Teacher candidates are required to spend at least one semester in a Spanish-speaking country. They are also required to pass an oral proficiency exam at the advanced low level prior to certification, which they are advised to take directly after returning from their study abroad semester.

Teacher candidates for certification must pass the Michigan Test for Teacher Certification (MTTC) Spanish Exam (Test #028). MTTC content exams should not be taken until 90% of course work in the subject area has been completed. The courses below meet State standards and have been selected so that teacher candidates will be well prepared for the test. Knowledge must be demonstrated in the following categories in order to successfully pass the MTTC subject area exam:

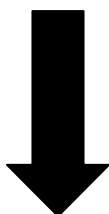
