

LATIN MINOR FOR SECONDARY TEACHING

Updated May 2019

The **minor in Latin** (State code: FD) for Secondary teachers consists of 20 credits. Students are required to study abroad for a May Term or Summer.

Teacher candidates for certification must pass the Michigan Test for Teacher Certification (MTTC) Latin Exam (Test #026). MTTC content exams should not be taken until 90% of course work in the subject area has been completed. The courses below meet State standards and have been selected so that teacher candidates will be well prepared for the test. Knowledge must be demonstrated in the following categories in order to successfully pass the MTTC subject area exam:

Subarea	Approximate % of Questions on Test
1. Reading Comprehension	30%
2. Language Structures and Comparisons	30%
3. Cultural Understanding, Comparisons, and Connections	15%
4. Language Acquisition, Instruction, and Assessment	15%
5. Writing	10%
