ENGLISH PROFICIENCY

Studying at Hope requires you to have a strong command of the English language because you will be fully immersed in our academic program. International students must demonstrate their English proficiency through one of the following:

- TOEFL: Minimum score of 79 no sub score less than 18
- IELTS: Minimum score of 6.5 no sub score less than 6
- Duolingo: Minimum score of 105
- GTEC: Minimum score of 1200
- Pearson PTE Academic: Minimum score of 58 no band below 53

Students from countries where English is the native/primary language are usually exempt from having to show English proficiency. However, verification of proficiency may still be requested if any information indicates there is an English language deficiency. For any of our incoming international or exchange students looking to brush up on their English, we do offer a three-week intensive English program in August.
