



# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

One of the HASP Board of Directors' accomplishments in 2023 was updating the HASP constitution and bylaws. During this lengthy process, some expressed confusion concerning the HASP/Hope relationship in regard to the perceived autonomy of HASP. I hope the following will clear up that confusion.

HASP is a semi-autonomous program of Hope College. Our autonomy is demonstrated in five areas:

- 1. Election of HASP leaders HASP members elect their own board members
- 2. Determination of the HASP annual budget the HASP Board of Directors sets the operational budget
- 3. Development of HASP curriculum the Curriculum Committee is responsible for course development
- 4. Selection of speakers the Monthly Program Committee is responsible for inviting speakers

5. Arrangement of HASP special events - the Special Events Committee develops all special event programs

The symbiotic relationship between Hope and HASP is beneficial to both in many ways. As HASP members, we have access to Hope resources, and Hope gains access to our experience and dedication to lifelong learning. The leaders of both HASP and Hope College are committed to maintaining this very healthy relationship.

# **BOARD MEETING SUMMARY**

The HASP Board of Directors met on **Tuesday, December 12, 2023**. Below is a summary of the meeting minutes. Numbers and figures reflect status as of the meeting date.

- Current membership: **744** (including 20 honorary members and two scholarship recipients)
- Over the past few months, the Communications Committee conducted a review of the HASP webpage and provided input for its redesign, with leadership provided by Amy Webber. Launch and promotion of the newly-constructed and user-friendly webpage is scheduled for early January 2024.
- To improve reporting efficiency, the 2024-2025 Membership Renewal will launch in May 2024 (up from July) without changes to the membership year which will remain July 1 June 30.
- Upcoming programming collaborations with the Holland Museum and Evergreen Commons are encouraged to broaden HASP's connection with and service back to the Holland and lakeshore communities.
- Current operating fund balance: \$224,874.46 (Currently under internal audit.)
- Current endowment fund balance: \$497,986.00
- The continued publication of the annual HASP membership directory was affirmed. It will continue to be available online via a password-protected .PDF document. The membership directory is frequently used by leadership and members alike. To avoid phishing schemes that have impacted the online security of HASP members in recent years, all public reference to emails and phones have been removed from the HASP webpage. It was also recommended that courses and regular notifications designed to protect members from elder fraud and financial exploitation should be offered.
- Pending official confirmation by a Hope College review committee, the Board approved an increase to full-time status and benefits for the position of Office and Project Manager, thus establishing a staff of two full-time employees, effective January 1, 2024. This approval is considered the first of several incremental staffing resource changes to reflect the valuable talents of current staff and the positive growth of the HASP organization.
- Following a unanimous vote of HASP members present at the Monthly Program on November 7, 2023, an
  updated HASP constitution was adopted. The new constitutional language now reflects existing practices,
  clarifies and consolidates administrative responsibilities, and re-emphasizes HASP's relationship with
  Hope College. HASP continues to retain autonomy over budgeting, electing leaders, curriculum, speakers,
  and special events.

We have formalized an "onboarding" process for calling every new member soon after they join - and again after they've been with us for six months. Committee members and additional volunteers make these calls monthly. This gives us the opportunity to again greet and welcome new members, answer questions, encourage attendance and participation, and give them a contact person to call if other questions arise. The six-month call reinforces our welcome and gives the new member an opportunity to inform us about their experience in HASP as well as offer suggestions. A spreadsheet has been created which is shared with the HASP office and callers, and this helps us to keep accurate records of our contacts. We feel this is important since many new members from the past year are new to the Holland and lakeshore communities, and they are discovering HASP on their own-often without an established member connection. We hope this new, regular communication will provide additional information about HASP, Hope College, and the community in general. Additionally, these calls help the Membership Committee to be more visible, efficient, and welcoming to all new members and guests.

All new and reinstated HASP members, or those looking for a refresher, are invited to a bi-annual New Member Orientation information session on **Thursday**, **February 1**, **2024**, at **1:00pm**, in the HASP Classroom to learn more about HASP and its peer-led committee structure directly from current leaders, ask questions, get involved, explore membership benefits, and meet other new members. #### COMPLETED

#### **DOCUMENT REVISIONS**

The Curriculum Committee Guidelines document, most recently revised in December 2020, was revised in 2023 with input from former Curriculum Committee chairperson Helen Klein, Judy Parr, and Ian MacNeil. The document was unanimously approved by the Curriculum Committee at its November 15, 2023 meeting, and Judy Parr submitted it to Board president John Kobs.

Helen Klein has been revising the course proposal form and is testing it with members of various Curriculum subcommittees. Our goal is to begin to use this for proposals for the Summer 2024 term.

#### **FALL 2023 COURSES**

During the Fall 2023 term, HASP members attended 53 courses, which were conducted over 89 sessions. Of those courses, 37 (67%) were single-session courses. The tables below represent a summary of this fall's courses (including modality numbers). Information from fall 2022 is provided for comparison.

#### **SPRING 2024 COURSES**

The Spring 2024 term will run from January 22 to April 26, 2024. This includes fourteen weeks of courses, with as many as 66 instruction days and 119 class sessions. Registration for Spring 2024 will begin **January 10, 2024**.

The table below indicates for each subject area the percentage of courses that are one-session only for Spring 2024. The 23.3% total shows great improvement over the 67.3% for single-session courses in fall 2023. Multiple-session courses enable exploring a topic in greater depth and provide more opportunities for scholars to become better acquainted with each other via discussions over several weeks.

#### **SUMMER 2024 COURSES**

The Summer 2024 term will run from June 17 to August 8, 2024. This includes eight weeks of courses, with as many as 29 instruction days and 58 class sessions. Registration for summer term will begin **June 5, 2024**.

#### SUBCOMMITTEE LEADERSHIP CHANGES

Curriculum subcommittee chairpersons are always looking for new members. Each new member can serve six consecutive years during a first and second three-year term. Chairpersons of subcommittees serve a maximum of three consecutive years.

With the retirement of Fine Arts co-chair Sarah Briggs, co-chair Lynne Williams will begin her third and final year as chairperson of that subcommittee. Sarah has been a tireless advocate for a robust and diverse fine arts curriculum, and we appreciate her dedicated service.

Tom Arendshorst has resigned as chair of the Humanities subcommittee, turning over the remainder of his term to fellow subcommittee member Doug Brouwer. Doug will begin his first year of a three-year term on July 1, 2024. I, as Curriculum Committee chair, approve this plan, thanking Tom for his service and inviting Doug to serve as Humanities subcommittee chair.

Chairing the Social Sciences subcommittee, Randall Miller stepped in last year to replace chairperson Larry Lynn who had resigned before completing his term as chairperson. Randall agreed to stay on with the Social Sciences subcommittee for a seventh year to serve as its chairperson 2023-2024. HASP member and Social Sciences subcommittee member Steve Norden has graciously accepted the chair position to begin on July 1, 2024.

Susan Couch is completing her sixth year as member of the Science, Medicine, and Technology subcommittee and her third year as chairperson of that subcommittee. Randall Miller has agreed to serve as its chairperson, beginning on July 1, 2024, and I approve of this move. He will bring to this subcommittee experience from his current role as chairperson of the Social Sciences subcommittee.

Volunteering will enrich your life and you will enrich the lives of others. The Service Committee appreciates your participation!

#### **SERVICE COMMITTEE**

- The Service Committee guidelines were updated and shared with the HASP board in September 2023.
- A promotional slide was developed in collaboration with HASP staff that has been screened at the start of the Monthly Programs and on the in-office digital monitor to promote the Service Committee and encourage volunteerism.
- We decided not to promote the Hope College Connection (a voluntary student mentorship program) as those who had previously added themselves to the program have never received any contacts.
- We plan to survey the HASP membership in May 2024 to find out if there would be interest in members participating in the One Big Weekend 5K Donut Run in October 2024.
- Overall, we have had a total of 45 members volunteer for Hope College and community projects. Several of these participants have volunteered more than once.

### **HOPE COLLEGE SERVICE**

 Seven in-class requests from Hope College faculty members (Carrie Bredow, Elizabeth Grimm, Steve Hoogerwerf, Nick Rolinski, and Katie DeKoster) were advertised and facilitated. These opportunities welcomed 56 volunteer interactions.

#### **COMMUNITY SERVICE**

- Chair Beverley Rannow has met with the Children's Advocacy Center and the Holland Museum to facilitate their requests for volunteers.
  - Contact information for the Children's Advocacy Center was passed on to both the Curriculum and Monthly Program committees as possible opportunities - resulting in a Spring 2024 course entitled "Stewards of Children: Protecting Kids from Sexual Abuse."
  - Contact information for Deb Wake, Holland Museum volunteer coordinator, has been shared with the Curriculum Committee as Deb has prepared presentations about Rosie the Riveter.
- A request from Eric Wilkinson, a WOHS teacher, was received for volunteers to share their life story with his creative writing class in connection with The Big Read and eight volunteers signed up.
- The Service Committee bulletin board currently has brochures from Kids Hope USA, the Momentum Center, the Paul G. Fried Center for Global Engagement, Mobility Worldwide, the Outdoor Discovery Center, the Children's Advocacy Center, and the Holland Museum.

#### RECENT EVENTS

- Shaw Festival 2023 (September 27-29, 2023): On this 3-day/2-night trip HASP's first international event since the COVID era 36 participants viewed three live plays: *Blithe Spirit*, *Gypsy*, and *The Amen Corner* on the lovely shores of Lake Ontario.
- Lake Geneva, Wisconsin (October 9-10, 2023): During this overnight trip, 43 participants toured the Johnson Wax Headquarters (designed by Frank Lloyd Wright), took a fall color boat ride of Lake Geneva, and visited other local historic sites.
- **Judgment at Nuremberg** (October 22, 2023): A matinee performance of Abby Mann's riveting courtroom drama presented by the Jewish Theatre of Grand Rapids welcomed 19 theatergoers.
