Program: Christmas Handbells

Our December program features two of our remarkable local artists, handbell musicians Larry and Carla Sue, and beautiful music to celebrate the Christmas season. Larry and Carla will present a selection of handbell duets arranged to require just eight bells and will be played in the traditional “four in hand” style. Larry and Carla will also talk briefly about the origins and history of tune-ringing on handbells, the various bells available, and some of the techniques used in playing these interesting instruments.

Larry and Carla started playing handbells in 1987 – Larry in California, and Carla in England. As a member of various UK-based handbell ensembles, Carla performed extensively throughout England, and also in Estonia, France, and the USA. Larry was a member and director of several handbell choirs in the San Francisco Bay Area. He is a published handbell composer, bass handbell specialist, and the author of *The Bass Ringer’s Notebook*.

Larry and Carla first met online on a website for handbell musicians. After a couple of years in a long-distance relationship, they were married in California in 2012 and started performing handbell duets together. In July 2016 they moved to Holland, Michigan – and since then, they have performed in New York City, Georgia, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Nebraska, and (of course!) Michigan. Special Interest Groups (SIG)

A Conundrum and an Experiment

At a meeting to evaluate proposals for winter/spring 2019 term, the Curriculum Committee faced a conundrum: what do we do with a proposal for a course to read and discuss a long book that, to do it justice, might take about eleven weeks? Most courses vary between one and four or five sessions. Can a group of readers sustain interest in an eleven-week course?

I imagine that in a group of about 800 people who seek out life-long learning experiences there might be several who might want to read and discuss such a book. A recent series of HASP courses called “Great Conversations” had about a dozen readers who often testified that reading something as a group and discussing it revealed insights that each reading alone would never have discovered.

So why not respond to this proposal by offering a free Special Interest Group (SIG) that those interested in reading and discussing the book would form? See what interest there might be in, for example, reading *Fado Alexandrino*, a novel written by Portuguese author António Lobo Antunes in 1990. Henry Ploegstra, potential convener of the group, describes the 497-page book as the “story of five Portuguese veterans of colonial wars in Mozambique who have reunited at a restaurant for an evening of recollection and drinking.” He adds that the translation by Gregory Robassa “brilliantly catches both the substance and the psychological overtones of the conversations.”

Think you might want to join a small group of HASP readers to escape chilly Holland, Michigan, during January, February and March to read this book and meet with others for an hour or so a week to discuss the stream-of-consciousness recollections of Portuguese war veterans? Based on the 1910 horror novel by Gaston Leroux, which has been adapted into many films, *The Phantom of the Opera* follows a deformed composer who haunts the grand Paris Opera House. Sheltered from the outside world in an underground cavern, the lonely, romantic man tutors and composes operas for Christine, a gorgeous young soprano star-to-be. As her star rises and a handsome suitor from her past enters the picture, the Phantom grows mad, terrorizing the opera house owners and company with his murderous ways. Still, Christine finds herself drawn to the mystery man. Andrew Lloyd Webber wrote the music in collaboration with Richard Stilgoe for the musical version.
