

I am going to see a show at Hope Repertory Theatre located in the Knickerbocker Theatre.

> The address is 86 East 8th Street, Holland, MI 49423.




There are two entrances to the theatre.

Either one I go through will get me into the theatre lobby.

If I go through the double doors on 8th street, I can walk straight ahead to the box office.


There might be a line that I should wait in to get my ticket.

I can also use the double doors from the parking lot to get to the theatre lobby.









If I use these doors, I will follow the hallway to

## more double doors.

Then the ticket office will be on my left.

I go to the ticket office to buy or pick up my ticket. The person there will ask for my name to find my ticket.

I can also ask the person at the box office for a sensory bag if I need it.

My ticket tells me where I am sitting, and what time the show starts.

Once I have my ticket, I wait in the lobby for the theatre doors to open. This happens about 30 minutes before the show starts.

won't be able to during


the show. The bathrooms

will be to the right of the

box office, down the

There is a water fountain in the lobby if I am thirsty.











My program will tell me if there is a break, or "intermission" in the middle of

About 30 minutes before the show starts, an usher will open the theatre doors. They will check my ticket before I find my seat.


Once I enter the theatre, an usher will guide me to my assigned seat. They will give me a program that has information about the show and the actors.


Once I am in the theatre, I will find a seat with the friend, parent, or guardian I came with and wait patiently for the show to start. I will try not to touch anything on the stage as I find my seat.

I will know when the show is starting when the theatre starts to get dark. Once the actors come out and the show starts, I will sit quietly and watch the show. I will remember that the actors can see and hear me, just like I can see and hear them.


I can clap or sign applause when a song ends to show that I enjoyed it.


If I feel overwhelmed during any point of the show, I can use any of the tools in the Sensory Bag, such as the stress ball, the fidget tool, or the headphones. If I need a break, a house manager will help me exit the theatre.











the show. This is when I can stretch my legs and use the bathroom before the second half starts.

Once the show ends, the actors will come out for bows. I can stand and clap or sign applause to show that I enjoyed the show. Other people will be clapping too. If this is too overwhelming, I can use the headphones in the sensory bag.

An usher will then help guide people out of the theater and back up to the lobby. I will wait patiently for my turn to get out of my seat and follow my friend, parent, or guardian out of the theater.

When I get to the lobby, I can return my Sensory Bag to an usher.

Once I am ready, I will leave the theatre with my friend, parent, or guardian.
